

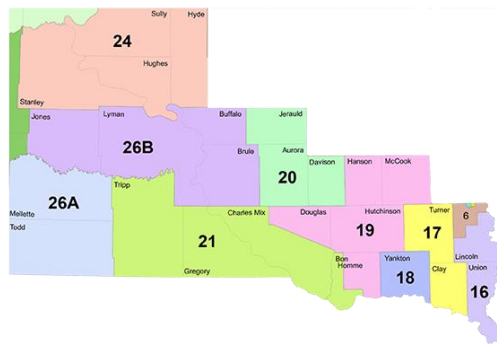

The FHA 2016 Legislative Voter Guide is a resource to help you cast an informed vote on or before June 7. This non-partisan publication is intended for educational purposes only and is not intended to influence a particular election or any particular legislation. It provides candidates' positions on issues so that you can decide which candidates accurately represent your values. Candidates were asked to respond with a **Support** or **Oppose** vote for each of the issues on this guide.

Uniform effort was given to contacting every candidate listed in this voter guide. Some candidates chose not to respond, others were unreachable. We urge you to call candidates who did not respond or visit their websites to find out where they are on the issues.

Issues Legend

1) MARRIAGE: Do you support or oppose legislation necessary to reverse the Supreme Court's 5-4 decision in Obergefell v. Hodges, which imposed same-sex marriage on all 50 states?

2) ABORTION: Do you support or oppose the 1973 Roe v. Wade U.S. Supreme Court abortion decision?

3) PLANNED PARENTHOOD: Do you support or oppose giving tax dollars to Planned Parenthood?

4) RELIGIOUS LIBERTY: Do you support or oppose legislation to ensure government non-discrimination in matters of religious beliefs and moral convictions with regards to marriage, the sanctity of human life, or human sexuality?

5) PROTECTED CLASSES: Do you support or oppose legislation that would include sexual orientation and gender identity as protected classes that are protected from discrimination?

6) SD HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC TRANSGENDER POLICY: Do you support or oppose legislation to void the South Dakota High School Activities Association's transgender policy, which allows a student to play on a sanctioned sports team contrary to his or her biological sex?

7) MEDICAID EXPANSION: Do you support or oppose Medicaid expansion in South Dakota?

8) EDUCATION: Do you support or oppose the national education standards and testing methodology often referred to as "Common Core"?

9) VIDEO LOTTERY: Do you support or oppose the expansion of video lottery in South Dakota?

10) PAYDAY LOANS: Do you support or oppose a maximum interest rate for payday loan companies?

11) GUN RIGHTS: Do you support or oppose legislation to allow concealed carry of firearms without a permit? *This would not eliminate concealed carry permit availability required for reciprocity with other states.*

12) MEDICAL MARIJUANA: Do you support or oppose legislation to allow the medical use of marijuana?

13) STUDENT PHYSICAL PRIVACY: Do you support or oppose legislation that would restrict access to restrooms and locker rooms in public schools according to the student's biological sex?

14) TAXATION: Do you support or oppose legislation that would exempt taxation on food and/or clothing?
